Introduction...



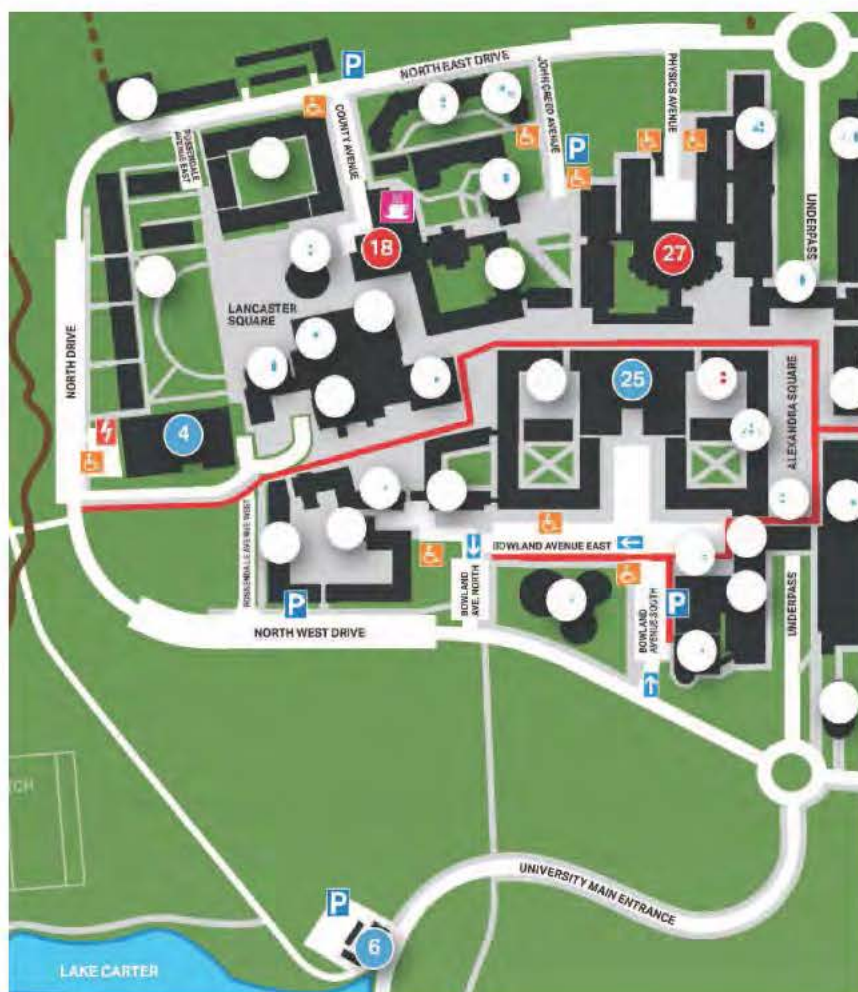
