Getting around:

There are **five individual language zones**, and a new general section – **'ALL Language Zones'** – covering all languages, but still fully tagged and linked to other sections.

You can navigate:

- **By language / section:** using tabs & drop down menus
- **Using 'search':** on the top right
- **Using tags:** on the bottom right (and top of articles)
- **By theme:** using featured articles

Click the top bar to return to the homepage.

What's new:

ALL Language Zones: now has archive material from Languages Today magazine and other publications, and from the journals when they were available in print; e.g. about projects and linked themes.

Online discussion area: there is now a new discussion area for feedback, networking and consultations.

German Language Network: we have also created an online base for our German Language Network as a pilot project, including events, initiatives, training & updates.
