Schools are adopting the approach to: broaden language provision, promote linguistic diversity, increase motivation and engagement, and to celebrate pupils' home languages. Languages currently being offered include: Afrikaans, Arabic, British Sign Language, French, German, Greek, Italian, Japanese, Latin, Latvian, Mandarin, Norwegian, Polish, Portuguese, Romanian, Russian, Spanish, Swedish and Turkish.
