### **KS3 Grammar**

- identify and use tenses or other structures which convey the present, past, and future as appropriate to the language being studied
- use and manipulate a variety of key grammatical structures and patterns, including voices and moods, as appropriate
- develop and use a wide-ranging and deepening vocabulary that goes beyond their immediate needs and interests, allowing them to give and justify opinions and take part in discussion about wider issues
- use accurate grammar, spelling and punctuation.






## Applying grammar

#### Into the Target Language

- Vocabulary test
- Oral dominoes (words or phrases)
- Written dominoes (words or phrases)
- Gap-fill (missing word)
- Translate simple sentences (grammar checkpoint)
- Find the English phrases in the Target Language text
- Parallel texts (reading and creation of)
- Redraft someone else's translation

### Into English

- Add titles (in English) to text in Target Language
- Paraphrase or summarise
- General questions on a text "what's the slogan?", "where might you see this sign"
- Question and answer in English (initial reaction)
- True / false or multiple choice
- Subtitles for a TV programme or advert
