Attending: Friday and Saturday

Reasons for attending: This is my first time attending Language World and I've chosen to attend both Friday and Saturday. With Language World there is training in all areas of the curriculum and for all key stages – I like the idea of short workshops which are often much more dynamic and you come away with a lot more ideas than one day on just one theme. I have chosen to attend session 1.1. as I want to find out how to successfully assess pupils' progress without putting them under undue pressure which could put them off language learning and 4.1 as I am hoping this workshop will advise on how to develop language provision so that children are building on their skills and knowledge. With session 7.2 I am looking for ideas and activities which will introduce grammar in a fun way and session 8.1 will be great to share ideas with other teachers and even better that it is in the target language!
