- ALL conducted a webinar around the Review in September, still available here:

- ALL is reassured by HMI that the OfSTED Handbook (EIF)
 is still the document of reference, with its focus on Intent,
 Implementation and Impact and on the Programme of

Languages Today 39: Inspection talking points

A spread in LT 39 looks at a Deep Dive in Secondary, and highlights some of the issues in the OfSTED Curriculum Review (see Notes).

Inspection is governed by the EIF, which looks at the National Curriculum, planning, progression and appropriate challenge. (For Academies etc. OfSTED expects the curriculum to be equally as challenging as the NC)

The Curriculum Review reflects current developments in thinking.




Basic steps

(see Notes)

- <u>Does your School</u> / Department Languages statement give a clear and accurate picture of how you deliver the Programme of Study to reflect the challenging curriculum proposed by your school?
- Do you have a rationale for how you approach current issues (reflected in the Curriculum Review):
- Teaching and re-visiting of Vocabulary and Grammar?
- Development of confidence in sound-spelling links?
- Sequencing learning? Remembering?




