Our online language publications have a new home!

The Language Zones contain articles, reviews and regular News and Notes sections informing readers about cultural and political events in the target language speaking countries, as well as specially selected archive content – an entirely interactive and interconnected archive on language teaching practice. There are also areas for cultural information, discussion, news and updates.

- **Francophonie**, the French Language Zone
- **Rusistika**, the Russian Language Zone
- **Tuttitalia**, the Italian Language Zone
- **Vida Hispánica**, the Spanish Language Zone

We've also created a new area for general information (**ALL Language Zones**), which covers all languages, and includes archive material from *Languages Today* magazine and other ALL publications, all fully tagged and linked to the other zones, which makes searching for articles easy!

The Language Zones are housed within our ALL Members' Area, and are only available to members of ALL.

Getting into the Zones:

- **How do I access the Language Zones?** You can log on here: www.all-languages.org.uk/membership/login. Simply log in to the Members' Area with your username and password.
- **What's my username and password?** Your username is the email address that you gave us when you joined ALL. You also selected your password when you joined us online – you can change this once you've logged in to something that's easier to remember!

Getting around:

New navigation: There are lots of ways to get around the site:

- **Using the search facility:** on the top right
- **Using drop-down menus:** hover over the different language tabs at the top to go to language focussed material (across themes)
- **Using tags:** scroll down to 'tags' on the right hand side – click on these to find theme based material (across languages)
- **Using featured articles:** articles relating to our theme of the month are listed on the middle right of the homepage.

- **Submit your own contribution:** ALL welcomes previously unpublished articles by readers and by all those interested in learning and teaching languages at any level in the UK and beyond.
