The new Programme of Study for languages at KS2 and KS3 charts a progressive development of phonics knowledge, that begins by exploring the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes and linking the spelling, sound and meaning of words, leading to the ability to transcribe words and short sentences with increasing accuracy.

This session looks closely at how to teach, embed and extend phonics knowledge, including the ways in which it underpins the development of all four language skills at KS2 and KS3. We will focus on practical strategies and ideas today that can be put into practice tomorrow!
