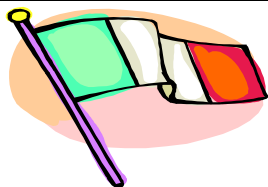

## SPEAKERS

**Carmela Amodio-Johnson:** Teacher of Italian since 1983 in London, Moderator & Examiner for City & Guilds, The Institute of Linguists and Edexcel GCSE, A/S, A2 examinations in the past. She has been Chair of ALL Italian Committee since 2006, responsible for events & Italian Days in London and the South-East.

**Bruno Cervi:** Teacher of Italian in London for more than 20 years he is now in charge of “Coasit”, (Comitato di Assistenza Scuole Italiane). He has been and still is the Edexcel Principal Examiner for A/S A2 Examinations in England.

**Danielle Hipkins:** Senior Lecturer in Italian at University of Exeter, Department of Modern Languages, SALL. She is a member of the Executive Committee for the Society for Italian Studies, which supports academic Italian studies in Britain and Ireland. Danielle is responsible for developing links with teachers of Italian in schools and adult education.

**Peter Langdale:** Peter is Head of Italian at North London Collegiate School where he also teaches French to A level and is Academic Tutor. He is a member of the ALL Italian Committee and edits the Independent Schools Modern Languages Association newsletter. As well as being a strong advocate of the use of ICT in language teaching (about which he spoke in 2009), he has always sought to incorporate literary texts (from *filastrocche* to Dante) in his teaching.

**Elisabetta Romano:** A young native Italian teaching Italian and Spanish at Enfield County School, a girls' comprehensive school in the north east of London. She has been teaching languages in the UK since 2005 and has recently been promoted to Assistant Subject Leader KS3 in the MFL Department. Her work explores how music and kinaesthetic activities have an impact on the learning of the pupils.

**Barbara Romito:** Head of Languages at Latymer Prep School in Hammersmith, London where Italian is taught to all children (165) in Years 3-6, together with French in Year6 only. As a secondary-trained languages teacher, she was brought in to the school, in 2005, for 2 days per week, to set up the languages department. Over the years she has found and used ideas and items from diverse sources that help Italian to be part of the daily life of the school.
