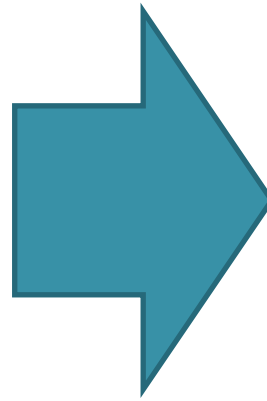



Culture Box

Post box	This is a typical British post box. Very traditional.
Red Bus Key ring	Many people think that all buses look like this. They used to 50 years ago. Many are still double-deckers, but they are no longer red and the entrance is now at the front not the back. These types of buses are now used as tour busses in London.
Local papers and flyers on interesting places to go	The local paper is the week the Christmas lights were switched on in Lichfield. Most town and cities have lights they decorate the streets with over the month of December and have a special night when they get switched on. Many of the inhabitants will collect in the centre of the town or city to see them on this evening. There will also be a large Christmas tree erected in the centre.
Marmite	A paste that is spread on bread. People either love it or hate it. It uses the yeast that the local brewery would otherwise throw away. It was first and still is made in Burton Upon Trent in 1902, which is about 10miles away from the schools.
Christmas Pudding	Two traditional Christmas puddings. Normally served after the midday Christmas <u>dinner</u> on the 25 th December. Served with brandy source or custard. Try it, but be warned it does contain a small amount of alcohol!
Eccles cakes	Just for <u>Nardeen</u> for being a great supporter of the project.
Giant Fizzlers and Love Hearts	Typical sweets that children buy from sweet shops.
Poppy Flower	These imitation poppy flowers are worn by people for the two weeks leading up to the 11 th November every year. This is done as a mark of respect for every soldier and civilian who has died in wars to defend our freedom. On the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month of 1918 the First World War ended.
Christmas Cracker	These are pulled by one person holding each end. There is a snapper inside which makes a bang. Usually a small present and a joke. They are pulled just before starting the Christmas
