The development of speaking skills in MFL continues to be a key focus for secondary schools. More recently it has featured on Teachers' TV and been showcased by the European Commission Molan Project.

Over the last couple of years, an ever-increasing number of languages departments across the UK have embraced the Group Talk ethos. Teachers who have introduced the project speak enthusiastically about its positive effect on the language learning environment and pupil attainment.
