A focus on...

CLIL at Chenderit School

CLIL has been introduced as an entitlement for all Year 7 students at Chenderit School since 2008. All students follow one hour of Geography each week in either French or German. In addition to this, students have an additional hour of CLIL delivered through either ICT, PSHE or tutorial time. In 2008, students could choose at the end of Year 7 whether they wished to opt for CLIL, but we have now decided that all students should follow a progression route into Year 8. The progression route for French is Geography in French and has now run for two years. We are planning to develop a progression route for German in 2013.

In 2009 70% of the students opted to continue and have followed progression routes through PSHE and tutorial time. This figure of 70% represents the students who according to research that we have conducted with the University of

A conference, two days of nonstop CPD, an exhibition, a social event, and a chance for teachers from all over the country to meet up with their subject community to celebrate language teaching and learning.

Aberdeen also see languages as an important part of their future. Transferrable skills are important, with 66% saying that they have strategies to help them learn. 82% say that learning language skills are important to them. 96% say that it is normal to make mistakes and that having a go is what matters, and 78% say that you don't have to be clever to use languages. There is now a culture of risk-taking and creativity in language learning which establishes students as effective independent international learners.

It is evident that the number of students gaining over level 4 in Year 7 is increasing year on year as the CLIL programme becomes more established. The cohort attainment on entry has not increased in this time, indeed it has decreased - the 2010 cohort had the lowest attainment on entry but has achieved the highest results.

New Postgraduate Certificate in Plurilingual Learning

This new course is led by Professor Do Coyle at the University of Aberdeen and is available as a part-time distance e-learning programme. The programme aims to

provide a deeper understanding of the demands of plurilingual contexts and their relevance to classroom practice including CLIL (Content and Language Integrated

Learning), EAL (English as an Additional Language), immersion and bilingual education across a wide range of contexts including those Do brought to the programme. It seeks to enable professionals to contextualise and define effective plurilingual education in their own setting, articulate their own Theories of Practice and engage in transnational networks.

The programme involves part-time study (2 courses) up to 18 months to achieve a Postgraduate Certificate, or part-time study for a Master's in Education of between 2-3 years. Assignments are of direct relevance to professionals in the field and consist of a portfolio of professional work applying principles to practice.
