Janine has taught German in secondary schools until July 2009 and is very aware of the constraints of time and energy on the preparation of lesson materials. She spent time in Berlin in 2009 studying the films suggested here and feels that the ideas deserve to go back into more schools. In response to what she perceives to be a real need, she has developed a series of inset hours that will provide German teachers with clear and practical guidelines and materials to launch a film either as an A-Level topic or as a project for younger classes.
