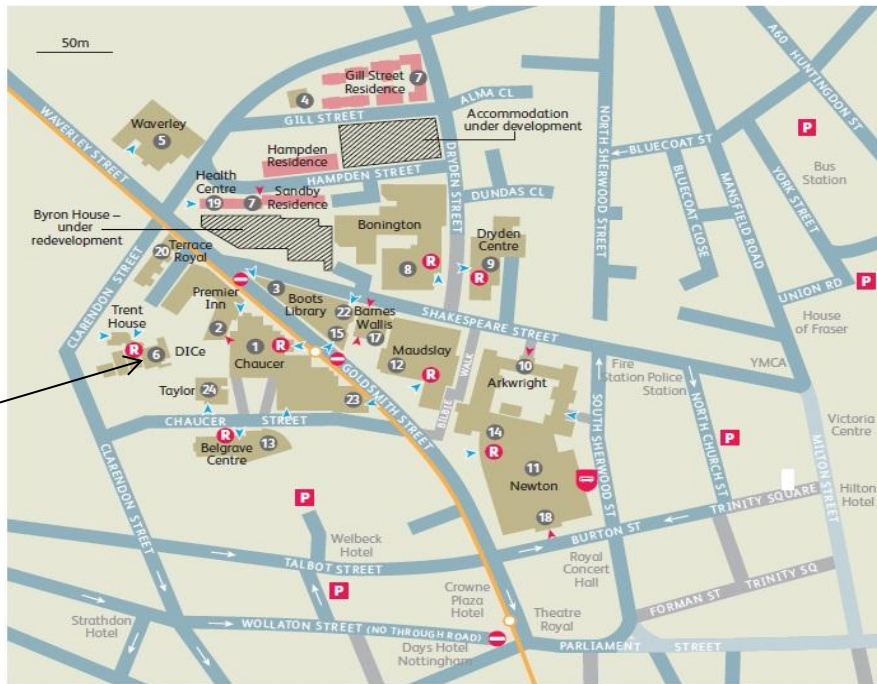

City site



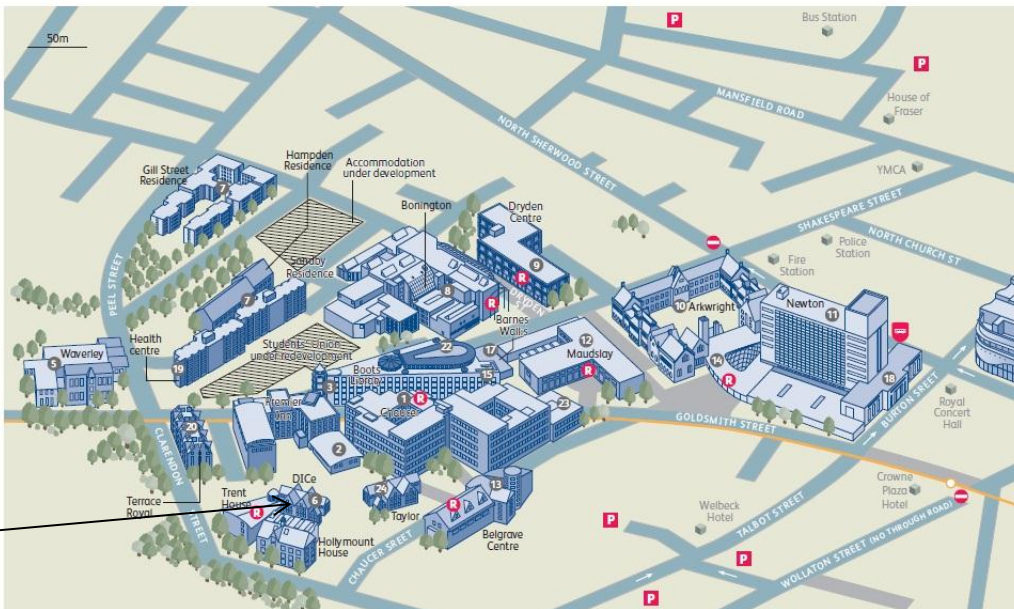
