Professional Development Consortium in MFL

Principle 1 ORAL INTERACTION

Target language input: learners encouraged to <u>ask questions of</u> what the teacher is saying or [ask] the teacher to repeat.

Principle 2 ORAL INTERACTION

Learners encouraged to <u>say things that they are not sure are</u> correct.

Principle 7 WRITING

Students should <u>write using their own resources</u> rather than resources provided by the teacher.
