# The numbers!

- Three regions and three regional co-ordinators
- Ten local centres in each and ten local lead teachers
- Fifteen module writers
- Four KS2 modules and five KS3 modules (Two-hour twilight and four follow-up sessions)
- All the ALL staff in the office!



# The song!

1. On the eighth day of September, the DfE said 'yes!' to a project called ALL Connect.
2. On the next day of September, the three regions were set: East, North East and North Midlands for a project called ALL Connect.
3. Sometime shortly after, fifteen writers they were found... for four KS2, five Ks3 modules in three regions for a project called ALL Connect.
4. In the month of October the three regions found ten local centres with ten lead teachers for four KS2, five Ks3 modules in three regions for a project called ALL Connect.



## The song cont'd...



5. In the month of November the modules were put up on the ALL WIKI!!! Four KS2, five KS3 modules in three regions for a project called ALL Connect.
6. In the dark months of winter the first twilights were held; teachers they met, ideas they were shared in the project called ALL Connect.
7. All in all the programme is expected to deliver 300 twilights to 4,000 teachers with modules from the ALL WIKI!!! Four KS2, five KS3 modules in three regions for a project called ALL Connect!

# Impact - transition



The KS2 training really made it clear to secondary colleagues that there needs to be dialogue between primary and secondary schools. One secondary colleague who has attended all sessions to date has now been given 1/2 day a week to coordinate primary links and work with primary teachers to oversee a coherent MFL programme of progression in all feeder schools. Another secondary school has invited all primary schools in and they are also working on a similar programme.

## WHAT ARE PRIMARY HUBS?

**A**LL primary hubs are an opportunity for primary (and secondary) practitioners to come together in their local area, and share ideas and good practice. The hubs are often linked to the work of local ALL Branches and Networks. They are usually – though not always – based in a local primary school, and aim to offer support in the provision of statutory languages at KS2, as well as preparing for the work that will continue in the secondary sector. 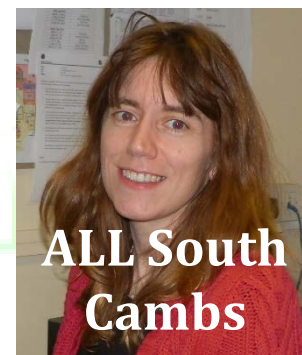
