



French Speaking Countries (33 countries)








It is assumed that Intercultural Understanding will be inbuilt in the planning of language lessons and other curriculum areas. Year 3:

- Identify the country/countries where the language is spoken
- Identify social conventions at home and in other cultures
- Make direct or indirect contact with the country/countries where the language is spoken
- Recognise a children's song, rhyme or poem well known to native speakers

Year 4:

- Talk about celebrations & traditional stories
- Compare aspects of everyday life at home and abroad

Year 5:

•Use empathy and imagination to reflect on other people's lives

- •Recognise similarities and differences in places
- •Compare symbols, objects and differences between places

Year 6:

- •Demonstrate understanding of and respect for cultural diversity
- •Compare attitudes towards aspects of everyday life
- Present information about an aspect of culture
