What's the future for language learning in the UK?

We'll be asking guests from the worlds of education, business, politics and the media about the challenges ahead for languages at Language World, the UK national conference for language teachers. Our panel debate, 'Future perfect?' takes place from 2:15 – 3:45pm on Friday 30 March at the University of Manchester.

Chair **Rosie Goldsmith** is a proud champion of languages and a journalist specialising in arts and international affairs, and our panelists will be actor **Larry Lamb**, known for his TV roles in Eastenders and Gavin and Stacey; **David Kennedy**, head teacher of the John Warner School in Hertfordshire; **Lizzie Fane**, founder of Thirdyearabroad.com; and **David Smith**, Head of the English Interpreting Unit at the European Commission in Brussels.

Larry Lamb is passionate about the importance of languages learning, especially for disadvantaged young people. "I'm a working-class boy from North London and learning languages opened up the world for me," he says. He is deeply concerned about the diminishing opportunities available for students for all walks of life to learn languages. "You can't put a price on it. If ordinary children are discouraged from learning languages, it weakens our society." Rosie will also interview Larry in a special one-on-one interview on **Saturday 31 March** at **9:50am**.

Language World is one of the biggest annual events for teachers of languages and brings together all that's best in the world of language teaching: top thinkers speaking on topics close to their hearts, leading practitioners sharing their latest resources, policy makers explaining the thinking behind recent developments and passionate teachers ready to share ideas and exchange views. Amid the current Curriculum Review, it encourages delegates to get connected, shape the debate, and to become part of the future of language learning.
