ALL has been involved in the development of resources for primary language teaching such as the Primary Project Box and the CFSA's Primary Languages bulletins, and is working on a web page to signpost high quality online resources for the primary sector. We work closely with the Goethe Institut, the Institut Français, Spanish Consejería and other cultural institutes that are providing free learning materials for the new primary curriculum. FLAME also has a resource-sharing wiki 'CLIL4teachers' which is free to access and has links to cross-curricular language learning materials that are available online free of charge.

To be part of the International community of language teachers: ALL is a founder member of the REAL network, an umbrella organisation whose aim is to represent the hundreds of language teachers associations in Europe and which has as an objective the development of pedagogic skills through exchanges and joint projects at European level.
