

## Terms and Conditions

All participants must agree to be bound by these terms and conditions:

1. To be eligible to apply, participants must be undergraduate students at UK universities at the time of participation. Nominator and nominee must complete and submit the entry form electronically by **Tuesday, 18<sup>th</sup> April 2017**. Late, incomplete, corrupted or incomprehensible entries will be ineligible. The application must be submitted by the nominator to [application@lond.diplo.de](mailto:application@lond.diplo.de).
2. Promoters of this call for applications and the one-day Masterclass in Translation as well as the one-day visit to the Frankfurt Book Fair are the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany, the French Embassy in London, the Institut français du Royaume-Uni and the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) London.
3. The Masterclass is organised in partnership with the University of Cambridge.
4. Excluded from entering the call are: 1) employees of the promoting institutions (see point 2) and any of the prize donors; 2) family members of the afore-named; 3) anyone involved in the administration of this competition.
5. Not more than one application to this call may be made by any one nominator. Each individual HEI, however, can nominate more than one suitable candidate given that each application is submitted by a different nominator.
6. The successful candidates will be selected and prizes will be awarded by a jury.
7. The successful candidates for the Masterclass will be notified by email by 20th April 2017. If a successful candidate does not reply by Monday, 24<sup>th</sup> April midnight, the candidate will forfeit her/his place in the Masterclass.
8. The successful participants in the Masterclass will receive a reimbursement of their travel expenses to Cambridge against a valid receipt for travel (cheapest, reasonable second-class travel by train only). The candidates will also receive full board during the course of the one-day Masterclass (including accommodation in Cambridge for one night).
9. The copyright of the translations produced in the course of the Masterclass remain with the authors. The promoters of the Masterclass reserve the right to reproduce the translations for publicity or promotional purposes in any given form (print or online). This right is non-exclusive but unlimited with regard to time and place of publication. The promoters shall be entitled to assign these rights to third parties (print and online).
10. From the participants of the Masterclass, two winners will be selected at the end of the Masterclass for a sponsored one-day visit to the Frankfurt Book Fair (between 11 and 15 October 2017). Final dates of the visit to Frankfurt will be communicated in advance of the Masterclass.
11. The two prizes awarded at the end of the Masterclass, i.e. one sponsored one-day trip each to the Frankfurt Book Fair, will include travel expenses and accommodation in Frankfurt (excluding full board) on the basis of an agreement which the winners will have to sign. The two winners will be required to organise their respective trips independently.
12. The prizes are as stated in the description of this call and are non-transferable and non-refundable. No cash alternative will be offered.
13. Additional travel costs, insurance costs, visa costs, personal spending money and items not explicitly mentioned in the prize description are not included.
14. If applicable, winners must hold passports which allow entry to Germany and are themselves responsible for obtaining necessary visas.

15. The decision on the successful candidates will be final and no correspondence will be entered into.
16. The selected candidates are awarded a place in the Masterclass on 27<sup>th</sup> April 2017 and two candidates from the Masterclass group are awarded a sponsored visit to the Frankfurt Book Fair (between 11<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> October 2017) on the basis that they are able to attend.
17. The promoters reserve the right to request the successful candidates to provide proof of identity and proof of their undergraduate status in the UK. Identification considered suitable for verification is at the discretion of the promoters.
18. This call/competition is governed by the laws of England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland and subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the respective Courts.
