Theme: What Primary Language coordinators need to know (2 of 4) The Primary Coordinator's Handbook

1) Background:

ALL was funded by DfE to create training (and other resources) at the time of the most recent curriculum review. These are entitled 'ALL Connect' and are all freely available on line.

ALL members created the ALL Connect **KS2 Language Coordinator's Handbook** to support teachers in Primary schools.

Key messages :

The ALL Connect KS2 Language Coordinator's Handbook is a **comprehensive** work written by practising Primary teachers and based on their experience.

The handbook sets out the expectations of the role of Language Co-ordinator, and subsequently aims to provide guidance, sample documentation and templates to support the work of the Languages Co-ordinator in:

- articulating a vision for language learning in the primary school;
- languages policy creation;
- curriculum planning and design;
- monitoring standards of teaching and learning;
- assessing and reporting progress;
- leading and developing other teachers of languages; and
- raising the profile of language learning in the school and local community.

2) Online support

A range of support, courses and resources for professional development is available through ALL and others.
