I have a hidden sheet with their SEN and Target grades and other needs so I can remind myself of who is Pupil Premium, ADHD, anxious etc. I have a sheet per class so I can have it on the board. Each student's name is in a little box so I can shuffle them round as I get to know them and work out the best seating plan over the year.

Top tip for name remembering: I have a reward sheet on the board with all their names in alphabetical order. Tick for each contribution. 3 ticks is HP. Then I can add it to SIMS (our behaviour management system). It really helps me a) to remember their names and b) to keep an eye on who is contributing. My students know I start asking questions to students who don't put their hand up (this of course depends on anxiety levels & I don't pick on people in a nasty way)
