

When teachers attend workshops or training events at CAFI, a teacher training institution in the region of Galicia (NW Spain) they like to take home a set of teaching tools that they can either transfer directly to their classes, or use to plan active and engaging lessons for their students. The ELAPSE team is creating a toolkit that will be shared with a wide range of novice and experienced teachers in a web-based format including video illustrations of the tools in use. The materials you will see on the site were specifically designed by a multidisciplinary team from different countries with expertise in various fields, which adds extra value to their quality.

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ELAPSE is providing to teachers free of charge, and in a single website :

- Readymade packages to encourage Primary and Secondary teachers thinking about developing their curriculum by planning a unit or more of class work where content from a different area will be taught in the foreign language. These will include lesson plans and teaching resources.
- Advice from other language teachers (Primary and Secondary) and trainers from different countries on how to get started and be

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successful. This will take the form of text and/or video clips.

- Practical strategies for teachers to develop their own lessons using the same principles, and to develop professionally.
- An introduction to this type of methodology (known by the acronym CLIL in English), references and further reading.

My favourite elements of the ELAPSE resources are the lesson plans on pointillism, on PE, on geography (and there are many more!) – all in a foreign language. They have a lot of illustrative material, and lesson resources including video and photos.

I've worked with these resources with teachers in the Gard, in France, and I know they work. I'm happy to improve them now and to share widely, thanks to this project.

The ELAPSE team has a lot of dynamism, and the workshops and meetings have a team spirit, respecting every different point of view.
