



 There are no wrong answers, but this will tune you in to OfSTED terminology. Wherever you see thesedots ... you need to fill the gap. The OfSTED word appears (in PPt mode) in purple below.

Positive findings

- Lessons are very structured and pupils have frequent chances to ...
- · ... revise previous learning before moving on.
- teachers understand the need for pupils to grasp ...the building blocks of language learning =
- phonics, grammar and vocabulary
- Staff model correct pronunciation and explain ... links.
- sound-spelling
- Pupils progress beyond writing individual words to sentences and paragraphs
- ... around the school show the high profile of languages
- Displays

There are many other possible answers, al equally valid!

Areas for improvement

- most topics ... are not taught in any particular order.
- develop understanding of how to build pupils' knowledge in French step by step.
- enough opportunities to practise and consolidate new vocabulary
- remember and use high-frequency verbs
- Teachers do not receive enough support
- (pupils') pronunciation is weak. This is because this has not been taught ...
- systematically in the past.

One of my favourite articles – how carousel-style lessons can be particularly successful in motivating primary language learning

Oxley, E. and C. de Cat (2019) A systematic review of language and literacy interventions in children and adolescents with English as an additional language (EAL). *LLJ* 49, no.3 doi.org/10.1080/09571736.2019.1597146

Interesting for providing wider context on language support in the UK. This study finds that explicit vocabulary instruction and targeted oral language practice yield language gains for EAL learners. Learners with less proficiency seem to benefit more from such intervention. The article emphasises the vital need for targeted support for EAL learners. Most interventions took place in primary schools, with little R&D happening in secondary schools.


