Dear ALL members,

I hope this busy term is going smoothly for you so far. I would like to take this opportunity to introduce myself and to share a spring update with you.

Introductions

As the Languages Subject Advisor at Pearson, I am here to support teachers with Edexcel language qualifications. My role also includes delivering training, promoting language learning and advising on MFL-related matters and developments.

I am an experienced MFL teacher with 17 years of secondary classroom experience teaching French and Spanish. I studied French and Italian at university and have spent time living in both countries, including several years working at Poitiers University in France.

I also have a background in digital publishing and spent eight years working for Teachit, first as Languages Editor and then as Senior Content Lead. I joined Pearson Edexcel in September 2021 and am looking forward to meeting you in person at future languages events.

New GCSEs in French, German and Spanish

On 14 January 2022, the DfE and Ofqual published the long-awaited results of their consultation on the revised content and assessment for French, German and Spanish GCSEs.

It has now been confirmed that these will be introduced for first teaching from September 2024. Students currently in year 7 will therefore be the first to sit these examinations in May/June 2026.

Details of other changes as they apply to specific language qualifications – for example, optionality and vocabulary restrictions/glossing for GCSE languages – can also be checked on the summer 2022 support tabs.

Grading

In summer 2022, all awarding bodies will set grade boundaries based on a profile that reflects a midpoint between 2021 and pre-pandemic grading, in line with <u>Ofqual guidance</u>. This is designed to provide a safety net for students, to reflect the disruption this cohort has experienced during the course.
