To apply you **must** be a current member of ALL, **actively involved** as a committee member of a Branch or as a **leader** of a Network or Hub and teaching Spanish in either a Primary or Secondary setting.



- A feature increasingly linked to TV programmes: additional sound track describing scenes for people with visual impairment
- A great challenge for advanced language students, raising awareness of the impact of visual impairment ... and how this can be 'mediated' through language
- Links in with the key CEFR notion of 'mediation' i.e. learning to use whatever resources available to communicate

From Language Learning Journal February 2023

- Teachers and school-aged learners: do they inhabit the same classroom world?
- Research by Littlejohn, Boye and Gardiner with school EFL learners in Brunei
- Learners put far more emphasis on language classes as 'social' events
- Not unexpectedly, teachers saw classes as 'pedagogic' events
- If "the twain don't meet", teachers will find it difficult to maintain learners' focus
- Conclusion: involve learners as much as possible in establishing aims, objectives and ways of working.

From Language Learning Journal February 2023

- Are mid career language teachers happy?
- Research with Austrian and English language teachers found no obvious differences between the two sets of teachers. Three key conclusions:
- They experience satisfaction from increasing confidence and sense of purpose
- Well-being is threatened by tensions between job and other responsibilities
- Desire for further professional growth frustrating if not available
- "Institutions should not be leaving these valuable experienced teachers to their own devices to sink or swim in terms of wellbeing and professional job satisfaction ...
- ...they should be explicitly seeking out ways to offer concrete support initiatives to ensure these
 teachers not only thrive during this time, but they also feel empowered to choose a pathway of positive
 long-term retention to remain within the profession."






