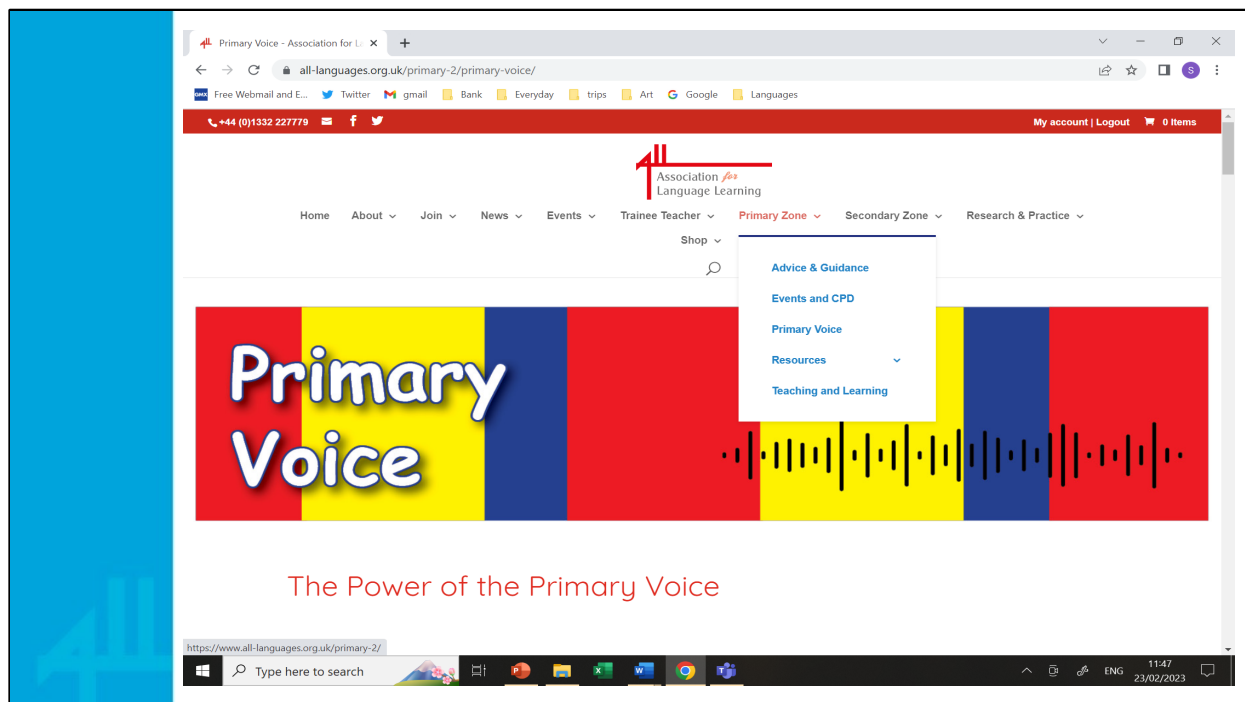

OPPORTUNITY TO JOIN ALL's ERASMUS+ EXPLORING AND DELIVERING CLIL COURSE, in MALAGA, JULY 2023

We have four places left on the final course - in Malaga from July 22-29, 2023

The course fee, accommodation, subsistence and travel are all funded by Erasmus+, the only cost to the participant is travel insurance which must be in place. To apply you **must** be a current member of ALL, **actively involved** as a committee member of a Branch or as a **leader** of a Network or Hub and teaching Spanish in either a Primary or Secondary setting.

The course builds on our ELAPSE project promoting a CLIL (content and language integrated learning) approach to language teaching and the introduction of ambitious content into language learning at both primary and secondary level.

2023 French summer school for Primary School Teachers

From *Language Learning Journal* February 2023

- **Are mid career language teachers happy?**
- Research with Austrian and English language teachers found no obvious differences between the two sets of teachers. Three key conclusions:
- They experience satisfaction from increasing confidence and sense of purpose
- Well-being is threatened by tensions between job and other responsibilities
- Desire for further professional growth – frustrating if not available
- “Institutions should not be leaving these valuable experienced teachers to their own devices to sink or swim in terms of wellbeing and professional job satisfaction ...
- ...they should be explicitly seeking out ways to offer concrete support initiatives to ensure these teachers not only thrive during this time, but they also feel empowered to choose a pathway of positive long-term retention to remain within the profession.”

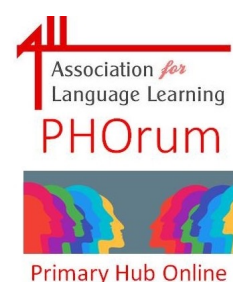
