GIMAGINE GERMAN PROMOTION PROJECT





- Bespoke support:
 - Deutschvorsprungsprogramm, Upskilling and professional development opportunities, conferences and events.
- Language courses & exams: Tailor-made formats for improving and building language skills.
- GEMs (German Expert Mentors): GEMs provide and develop classroom expertise for the German classroom.









- Teaching materials and concepts:
 Materials on relevant topics in the curriculum which can be used for teaching German.
- Promotional materials: Information material, decoration and prizes for the German classroom and events.
- Starter kits for schools: Specially developed sets to support schools wishing to (re-)introduce German.

- Employability: Offers to raise awareness of the importance of the German language for study and work,
 e.g. Career Roadshows
- Youth Mobility: Exchange opportunities for young people to Germany.
- Language & Culture: Motivational projects and courses to gain an insight into German culture and language









- Advocacy: Information trips and conferences for head teachers and decision-makers.
- Campaigning for MFL: In cooperation with the British Council.
- Low-key activities: For an easy start into the German language.

Progress through principles

- 1. Every learner a language learner
- 2. Majority of young people studying a language to 16 to GCSE
- Systematic progress phonics, vocabulary and grammar
- 4. Stimulating content, enriching knowledge of culture, history and literature
- 5. Opportunities for interaction with native speakers in person and online
- 6. Develop biliteracy, building on grammar from primary NC for English
- 7. Strengthen transition from primary to secondary schools
- 8. Plan progress in pupil and teacher use of the target language in class
- 9. Use pupil error constructively to inform teaching and encourage learning
- 10. Teach listening, speaking, reading and writing as integrated skills
- 11. Provide two to three hours of well spaced teaching time
- 12. Ensure grouping and setting meets the needs and potential of all pupils
- 13. Develop a range of assessment techniques to support progress
- 14. Provide systematic development of early career teachers' subject specific knowledge

Overarching aims:

- to understand what works, how it works and why;
- to provide robust evidence to inform future policy making
- Priority setting partnerships: stakeholders work collaboratively and democratically to set meaningful, relevant and situated research agendas
- Practice-led research: generate new knowledge that has operational significance for practice; e.g., probing effective pedagogy, successful school partnership, language subject leadership





Becoming a Hub Lead School – Timeline:

- Wednesday 26th April Wednesday 17th May (midday): 2nd stage application form live.
- Thursday 18th Friday 19th May: School applications are longlisted.
- Monday 22nd Friday 26th May: NCLE sent clarifying questions and shortlisted schools for interview.
- Tuesday 30th May Friday 2nd June: Half-term!.
- Friday 9th Friday 23rd June: Online meetings (around 45 minutes) with Head Teacher and Subject Leads.
- Monday 26th June: UCL selects 15 Lead Hub Schools a/c 9 regions to share with DFE
- Early July Hub leads are recruited (followed by contracts to be issued and signed)
- Monday 11th September: Online launch for all ... followed by work with Specialist Teachers
