Events and activities

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Stephen Spender Prize

Bring creative translation into the classroom this summer term with the Stephen Spender Prize for poetry in translation, open for entries until 31 July.

The competition is free to enter for all schools in the UK and Ireland, with age categories from KS1-KS5. It has a dedicated strand for teachers submitting on behalf of pupils, the Schools Laureate Prize, which welcomes up to 5 entries per age category from each participating school.

Students can pick a poem from any language to translate, or choose one from the 50+ languages in the Schools Laureate Prize poem bank. This year there's also a special language focus with the Portuguese Spotlight, with pupils invited to translate one or more poems from a specially curated booklet of Lusophone poetry.

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- To help you prepare your students and choose your school's final entries in each age category, the Stephen Spender Trust has created a collection of Build Your Own Creative Translation Project resources.

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

The programme

Target group & scope:

13-18 y/o learners (flexible) with(out) German (two levels), 20-25 hours

Acquiring first German skills and global future competencies through fun, engaging multimedia activities that offer a real sense of achievement

- Group submits short video or text




