

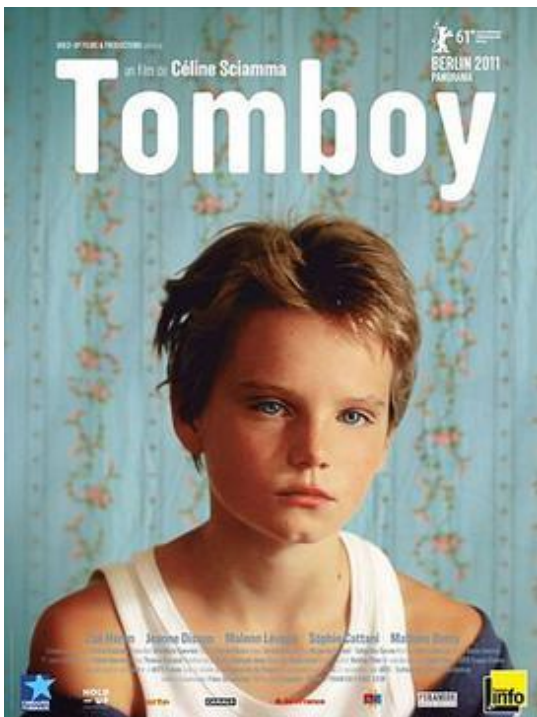

## **Tomboy**

At the beginning of summer, 10-year-old Laure and her family move to a new home near Paris. While exploring her new neighbourhood, Laure befriends a local girl who assumes that Laure is a boy. Laure doesn't correct her and embarks on a summer-long reinvention as 'Mickäel'.

The film explores the significance of gender identity in social interaction and in the family circle from an early age in the context of childhood play and love. Sciamma's coming-of-age portrait of a child navigating their identity and place is intimate, empathetic and timelessly relevant.
