### Ø Schools Laureate Prize

Our dedicated strand for schools, designed **for teachers submitting entries on behalf of students**. Open to **all schools in the UK and Ireland**, including homework clubs, Saturday schools, private tutor groups and home-schools, as well as British schools overseas. The strand features **age categories at KS1-5 / P1-S6** and a <u>bank of suggested poems in over 50 languages</u>, along with a choice of creative response formats to enable students to practise different creative skills.

The rules are simple: translate **ANY poem from ANY language** and produce an accompanying commentary, reading, artwork or creative writing response, for the chance to join the Stephen Spender Prize hall of eternal fame!
