Bristol University Language Festival, June 2025

As part of Widening Participation, the School of Modern Languages at University of Bristol organised a one-day Language Festival for Year 8 pupils at a critical moment in their education before Options in Year 9.

We welcomed 50 pupils from four different local state schools who each attended two workshops in different languages: Spanish, Italian, Czech, French and German, and a lecture in linguistics with James Hawkey who added in some Portuguese abstracts and mentioned Catalan too!



We had a really good discussion at the end of the day about what studying modern languages at university entails. Pupils also asked some great questions to our student ambassadors who assisted throughout the day too. For many of our young guests, it was their first time stepping into a campus.
