In her Primary Blog Clare Seccombe suggests we start to think about how we will respond to the CAR consultation, and the Government's response – when that arrives:

- KS2 Content – *‘Should it just be ‘phonics, vocabulary and grammar’, or should it be wider reaching, and include cultural content, for example?’*
- *‘ ... we owe it to ourselves to sing out loud about what we do that works.’* What will you sing about?
- Transition – do you have a case study to share?
